
In 1865, J. L. Nowlin set wood post and made the following BTs: White Pine, 12", N.77°E., 15 links; Fir, 6", S.12°W., 7 links.

In 1975, Philip Hansen found a squared and scribed Cedar post which was recovered in 1948 by Consolidated cruisers and maintained by Ray Leigh, a Consolidated Forester. Hansen also found a Hemlock stump, N.48°E., 15.7 links, scribed T.37N., R.15E., 15. Hansen replaced Cedar post with a 2" galvanized iron pipe and added the following BTs: Sugar, 9", N.85°W., 41 links; Sugar, 8", S.21°W., 30.4 links.

In 1985, Milo Stefan found Hansen's monument and a White Pine stump at N.77°E., 9.9 feet. Accepted this location and added new ties.


