

  - In 1985, Dean Young & Don Huettl found bearing trees dead and selected the following corner references:

5" N07°W 39.69 ft. Black Spruce SSP 1.5 ft. East 4" S05°W Black Spruce 18.65 ft. SSP West 1.0 ft.






