
U. S. PUBLIC LAND SURVEY MONUMENT RECORD

- (b) Describe any record evidence, manument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence o any other material evidence you considered, and whether the manument was found or placed.
 - In 1859, James McBride set a wood post at the corner and selected the following bearing 8" S45°E 8 lks. Cedar 10" S21°W 8 lks. Cedar trees:
 - In 1982, Kim Pritzlaff found no evidence of original corner. Restored by using single proportionate measurement between NW and SW corner of Section 10. Set a 2" dia. driveable aluminum Bernstein monument and selected the following corner references; 6" S54°W 18.60 ft. Cedar 5" S08°E Cedar 22.31 ft. SSP N12°W 2.0 ft.
 - In 1990, John Schulke recovered the monument in place and the following corner references; Cedar 7" S58°W 18.64 ft. Cedar 6" S08°E 22.22 ft. SSP 2.0 ft. N10°W The following new corner references: N10°W 24.08 ft. 8" Spruce N65°E 40.80 ft.


