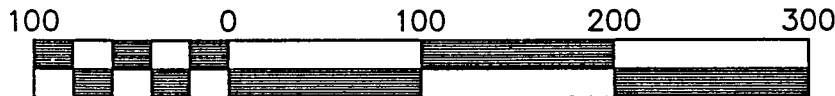
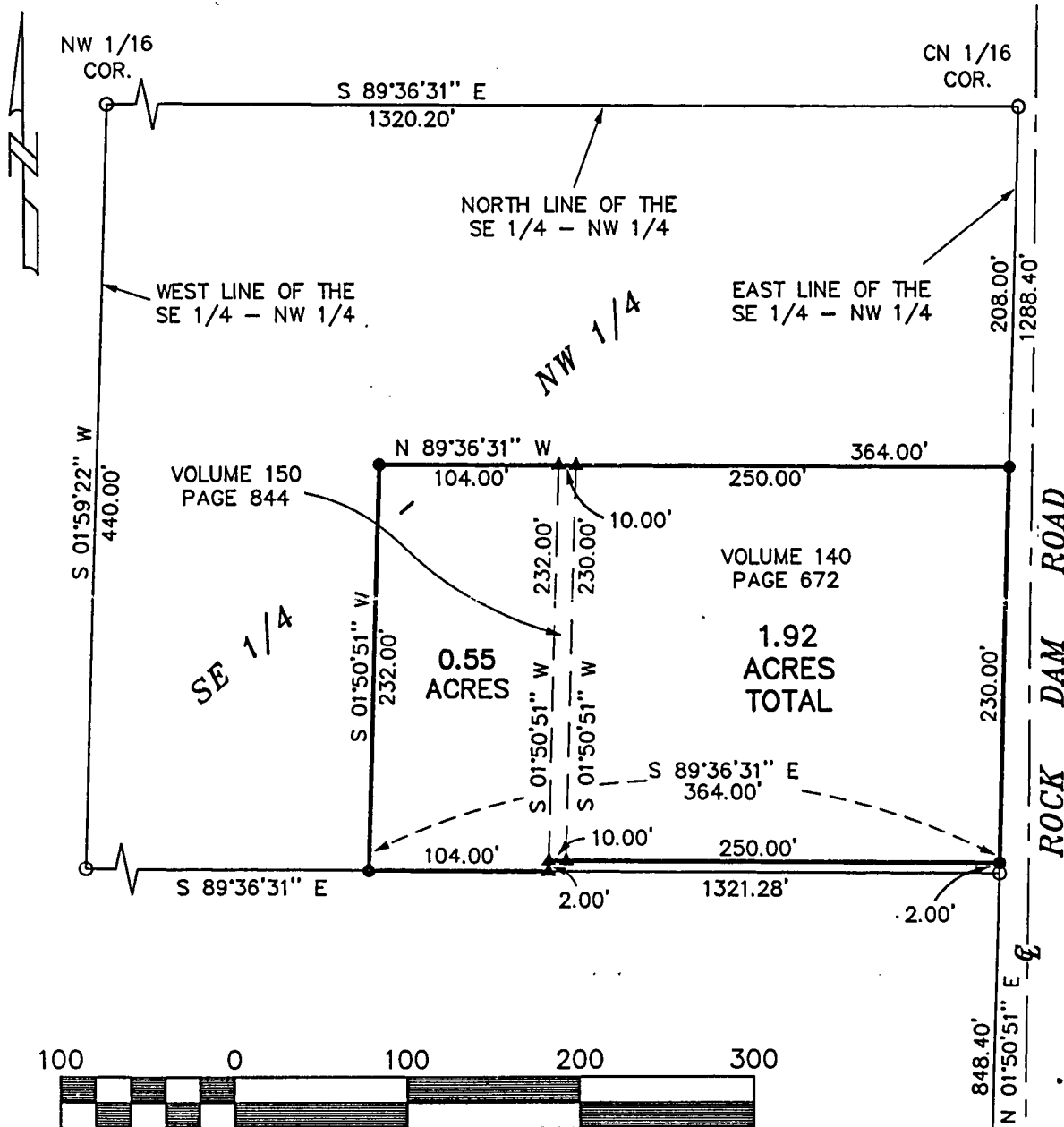

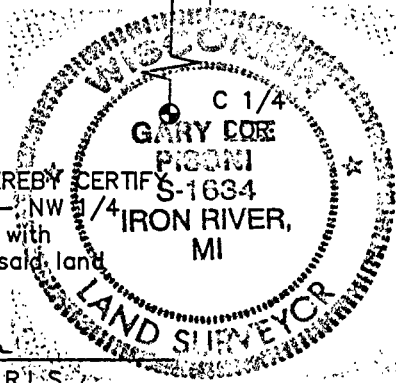

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## LEGAL DESCRIPTION


( Spencer Parcel )

A parcel of land located in the Southeast One-Quarter of the Northwest One-Quarter of Section 22, Township 41 North, Range 13 East, Town of Alvin, Forest County, Wisconsin.

Commencing at the Northeast corner of the SE 1/4 - NW 1/4 of Section 22 marked by a rebar pin; thence S 01°50'51" W along the East boundary line of the SE 1/4 - NW 1/4 a distance of 208.00 feet to a rebar pin; thence N 89°36'31" W and parallel to the North boundary line of the SE 1/4 - NW 1/4 a distance of 260.00 feet to the POINT OF BEGINNING; thence S 01°50'51" W and parallel to the East boundary line of said forty a distance of 232.00; thence N 89°36'31" W a distance of 104.00 feet to a rebar pin; thence N 01°50'51" E a distance 232.00 feet to a rebar pin; thence S 89°36'31" E a distance of 104.00 feet to the POINT OF BEGINNING and containing 0.55 acres of land.
