

# U.S. PUBLIC LAND SURVEY MONUMENT RECORD

(As Required By s. A-E 5.02, WI Adm. Code)

History of original corner establishment and subsequent restorations and description of any record, monument, occupational, testimonial or other evidence considered:

In 1857, A. Millard, set post and established 2 B.T.s; a Sugar 12" N.60°E. 65 lks. and a Y. Birch 12" S.38°W. 37 lks.

No further record evidence was found;

In 1991, I found a piece of ancient iron grader blade upright in a very old stake hole; no other evidence apparent; This point was located by traversing the S.½ of the N.S.¼ line and W.½ of the W.½ of the N. line of Section 7 and projecting these lines to an intersection, the stake hole agrees with this projected point very well.

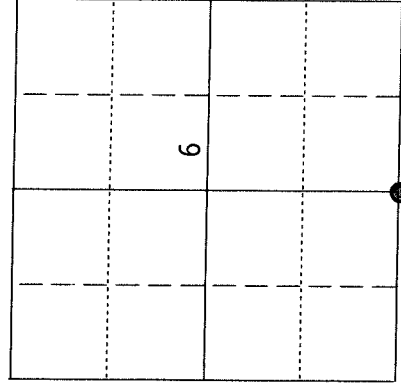

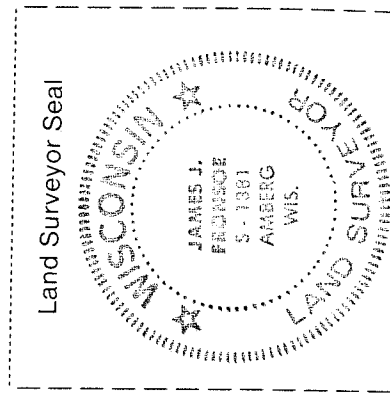
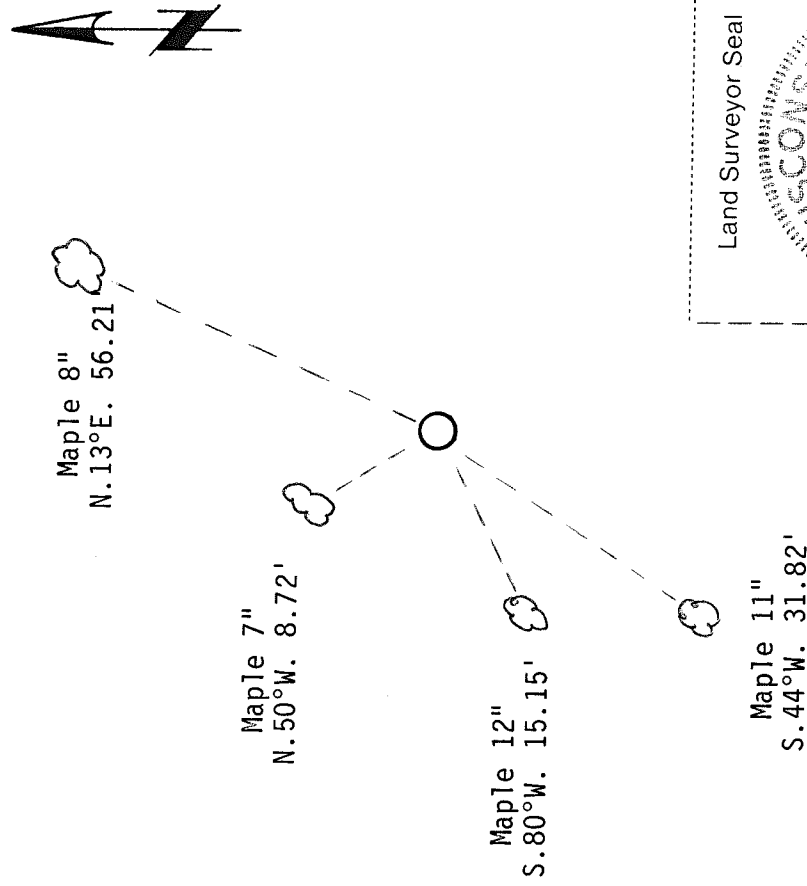
Describe the monument and accessories used to perpetuate the location of this corner. (include a plan view drawing and indicate what was set and/or found)
