Island in Bass Lake Situate in Sec
12 Township 33 North of Range 10 East of
the 4th Principal Meridian State of
Wis
Survey Commenced Aug 22nd and
Completed Aug 22nd 1901

Anticipating that I would have this
work to do I and one of my
assistants C. W. Faurtillott, I did on
the 5th day of May (the ice being in
good condition) we chained the
distance from the meander cor on south
side of Bass Lake between secs 11 & 12
and a flag which I had placed on
the west end of the island, and found
the distance to be 8 chains or 20 lks
on Aug 22nd I commence survey of
island with a Young's Sons Conklin
compass in correct adjustment
Setting up my instrument at meander
cor on south side of Bass Lake I found
the course to the flag to be North 22° 30' East
I set a white Pine Post at flag for
auxillary meander cor from which
a white Pine 18" in diameter
Bears North 58 East 7 lks

- 3.20 Thence North 73° E 3.20 " " 1 " "
- 2.20 Thence North 34° E 2.20 " " 1 " "
