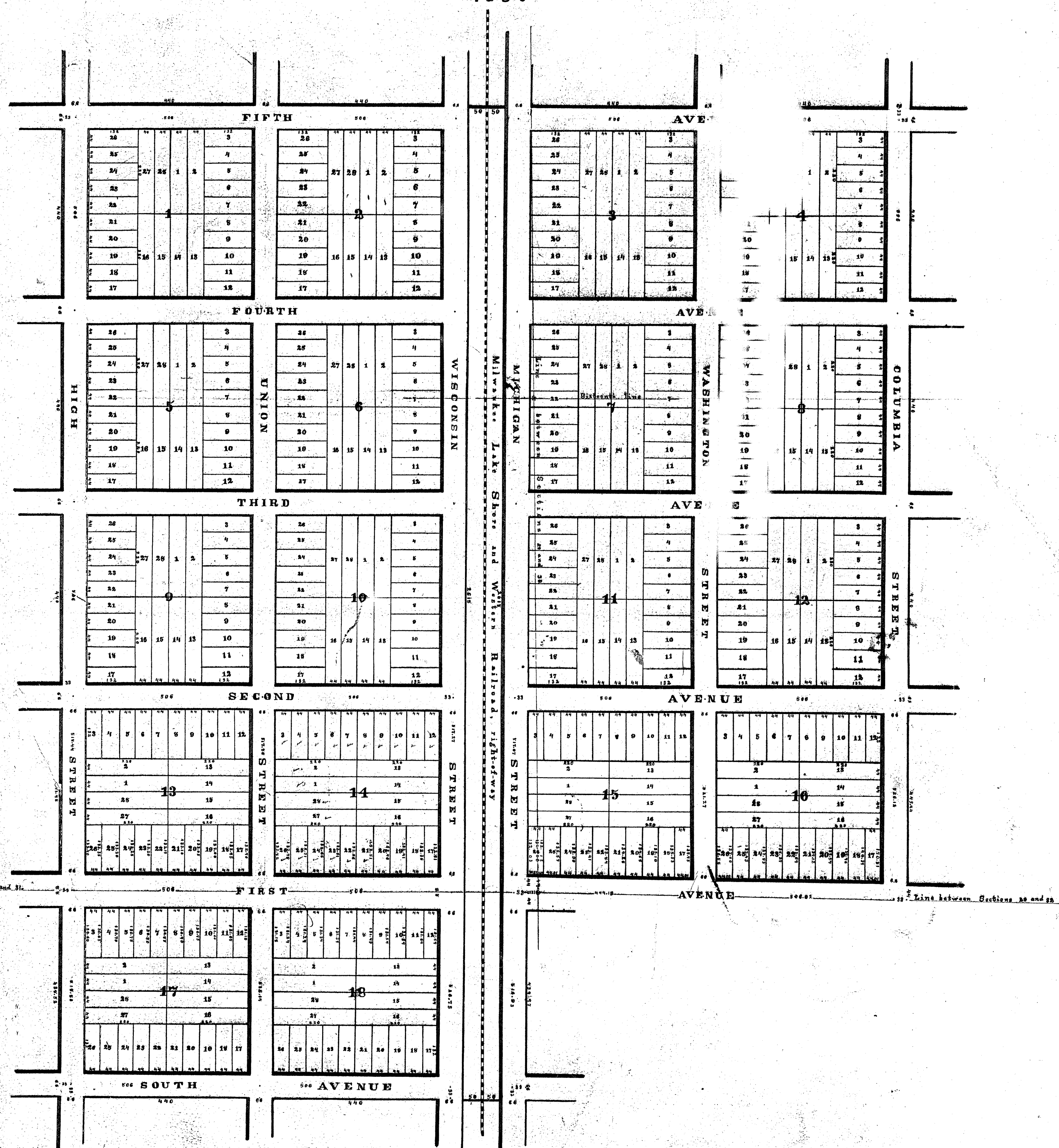


SURVEYORS CERTIFICATE.

State of Wisconsin }
Langlade County }

I, B. F. Dorr, Surveyor do hereby certify that by order and direction of James T. Reeve, and Laura S. Reeve his wife, and in full compliance with Chapter 101 Revised Statute of 1878, I have surveyed and mapped a part of the west half of the south-west quarter of section number Twenty-nine (29), and a part of the east half of the south-east quarter of section number Thirty (30), and a part of the north-east quarter of the north-east of section number Thirty-one (31), in Township number Thirty-two (32) North, of Range number Eleven (11) East, 4th Principal Meridian, and in the County of Langlade, and particularly described as follows, viz:

Commencing at the point on the stone at the section corner between said sections number 29, 30, and 31, marked thus  on the map and running thence west on the center line of First Avenue (Section line) to the east line of Michigan Street 200 feet, thence south on the east line of said Michigan Street, to the south line of South Avenue 200 feet, thence west on the south line of said South Avenue to the west line of High Street 100 feet, thence north on the west line of said High Street to the north line of Fifth Avenue 200 feet, thence east on the north line of said Fifth Avenue, to the east line of Columbia Street 200 feet, thence south on the east line of said Columbia Street, to the center line of said First Avenue (Section line) 200 feet, thence west on the center line of said First Avenue to the place of beginning 200 feet.

That to permanently establish the center line of First Avenue on the straight section line, I have set at the south-west corner of said section 29 a Bluish Stone 15 inches by 15 inches and 12 inches thick, and at the south-quarter post of said section 29 a Gray Boulder—not measured—size about 12 inches x 12 inches and 12 inches thick—wedged toward the top, and at the south quarter post of said section 30 a Bluish Stone 9 x 15 inches and 12 inches thick.

In the top of each of the above stones is a half inch hole 2 inches deep, filled with stone coal. Said hole is the point from which to measure.

Directly under said hole, and under the stone is a one and quarter inch hole in the ground six inches deep filled with stone coal.

Over the hole in each stone is a tapering pine post four feet long, and five to five and half inches square at the top, with a nail head in the top, directly over the hole in the stone.

The top of said stones is four feet below the surface of the ground, except the stone at the said section corner, on which a block of wood 6 inches by 6 inches and four inches thick lies between the stone and the post.

The large figures placed at or near the center of each Block, represent the number of the Blocks, and the small figures placed at or near the center of each lot represent the number of the lots.

All the north and south lines are parallel with, and the east and west lines at right angles to the Milwaukee Lake Shore and Western Railroad, except on First Avenue which runs parallel with a straight line between the respective points on the three above specified stones, regardless of the course of the said Railroad.

That the within map and the accompanying notes and explanations thereto, are correct representations of all the exterior boundaries of the land surveyed and of the divisions therein made.
